Vickie Russell plays Coffeehouse May 20

It's been an interesting coffee house year so far, ranging from the famous (Ronny Cox) to the not-quite-as-famous (Tim Harrison) to the "wow-he-ought-to-be-famous" (Travis Wetzel). We're closing the spring portion of our series with a Friends of Folk newcomer and some real old-time FoFers. As noted in these pages before, springtime is a time of change and renewal, so that's where this month's coffee house is headed.

For the change part, we're presenting Vickie Russell, a gifted composer, pianist, and vocalist now living in New Paltz, NY. Vickie will be appearing with her SO, David Michael Peters, who incidently is from the Milford area. Vickie was at Cooldog about a year ago and presented a marvelous set of music. She's leaving the Hudson Valley and heading for Delaware again, and we're glad she'll be performing for us. According to her web site, Vickie was born in New York City but grew up across the river in Plainfield, NJ. She "started ballet classes and playing piano by ear at the ripe young age of 3. Melodically influenced by the ballet music, her father's masterful whistling, and her mother's and grandmother's piano playing, by age 5, Vickie knew she wanted to be a performer, her goal: "to be famous". Formal piano lessons started at age 6. Vickie remembers the moment when she heard Elton John for the first time at age 12 and knew she wanted to sing and play piano for her life.

"At age 16, her family moved to Tampa, Florida, where she started singing and playing guitar, affected by the southern rock and country style of the area. New Orleans was her next residence, where she studied film, music and psychology, but her real musical training came at night in the clubs on Bourbon Street where she joined her first professional band. After completing her psychology degree in early childhood development with honors at the University of Florida in Gainesville, all the while performing in clubs nightly and creating a local name for herself, she headed up to New York City, and played the club scene. She continued studying jazz dance, acting, music theory, voice and piano, dabbling in recording studio, theater and film work.

"Her study of psychology left her with a deep quest to understand the human spirit, and as she began to write songs, this was reflected in the depth of her lyrics. Some of her influences are: Chopin, Aretha Franklin, Sting, Elton John, the Eagles, James Taylor, Bonnie Raitt and Shawn Colvin. Her love of melody is another strong element of her music. And then there is her voice, described as: 'Clear and strong, ranging from lilting to passionate, and her (piano and guitar) playing, likewise, often belies its apparent simplicity with richness of effect. Lyrics are evocative, personal and often spiritual.'

"Vickie began doing some interesting shows, opening up lectures for New Age speakers such as: Marianne Williamson, Bernie Siegel, festivals and



conferences with audiences of 1500 people or more. Next, she met the members of the Jimmy Buffett band and recorded 10 songs, one of which landed on a benefit compilation CD

for Cerebral Palsy, featuring performers out of Hoboken, N.J. such as Marianne Farley and Margo Hennebach. This received much local airplay, and kept her touring in the New England area. Meanwhile, it was time to move out of the hustle and bustle of New York City. Vickie needed some tranquility to continue her songwriting. She moved to a small college town: New Paltz, N.Y., in the Woodstock area to a quiet farm with a panoramic view of the mountains. 'All you can hear is the wind, the birds and your own ideas.'

"Touring Germany followed, with another compilation CD under her belt put out by a club she often plays in Hamburg. Now it was time to make her own CD. Vickie went to New York City's independent record label Prime CD's studio and recorded 12 songs that would represent her sound while touring solo. The CD was called 'As Written' and is now out of print. Vickie spent 6 months in 1997 touring Europe, selling CDs, doing live television performances and

getting rave reviews from the press. The Mainzer newspaper from Mainz, Germany reviewed her concert there: 'The music of the songwriter from New York couldn't have been better. Her songs follow the tradition of classic folk rock, again and again enriched with the elements of blues, funk and country. The music is strongly melody-oriented, catchy and extraordinarily harmonic without being commercial. The slow melancholy songs get under your skin and have big "Goosebump potential", which is enforced too by the powerful and expressive voice of. She tells stories out of real life, describes feelings everybody in the audience knows, which she works out representatively for everybody.'

"On her return, she wanted to get involved in a more local music scene and started a Songwriters in the Round night, Bluebird style, at a local cafe, booking, hosting and opening the evenings. Vickie ran these evenings for 4 years. She interviewed the guests about their writing processes, musical background and influences. The once a month event got local legends out of hiding and much attention. Her latest CD, 'Welcome Home' was released in October, 2003 at the Unison Arts and Learning Center in New Paltz, NY to a sold out crowd. It was recorded in Palmer, MA, Woodstock, NY, Rosendale, NY and New Paltz, NY. At her CD release party, she was joined by fellow Woodstock legends: Garth Hudson, Amy Fradon, Too Human's Roger Bruno and Ellen Schwartz, Dave Skoglund, Amanda Rothenberg and David Michael Peters. Vickie is now touring extensively throughout the country to support this album and she is working on the follow-up.

"Quirky facts about Vickie Russell: She loves to rollerblade, ice skate, swim, ski, and swing dance. Her goal is to make all of her own dishes on her pottery wheel. Ethnic food is her passion: Japanese, Indian, Mexican. She loves to garden, springtime is her favorite time of year, watching the tulips come up. You will find her on her lawn often, flat on her stomach, sniffing her hyacinths. Favorite CDs: Jill Sobule-Happy Town, Kim Richie-Bitter Sweet, James Brown's Greatest Hits, Preacher's Wife soundtrack, Gahrlick Ohlsson's Chopin waltzes."

She has recently appeared at venues such as Ulster County Community College, Howard Community College, State University of NY (New Paltz NY), Kindertransport Convention (AZ), Towne Crier (Pawling NY), Town Hall Theater (NYC), The Music Hall (Tarrytown NY), Oxygen Tank Tour 2000, Sydney's (Rehoboth Beach DE), Bardavon Theater (Poughkeepsie, NY), Woodstock Festival (Yasger's Farm), Bodles Opera House (NY) and Genghis Cohen (LA).

Opening the evening will be our olde friends in Celtic Harvest. These five have a great time playing old-time Celtic (aka Irish Traditional) music with some

more modern songs thrown in for good measure. Jan (flutes, whistles, concertina) and Kelly (fiddle, bodhran, flutes, and whistles) Crumpley, along with Kathy Doyle (piano, guitar, vocals) and her husband, the lovely Jim McGiffin (bass, guitar, vocals, and banjo), share joint custody of Mike Nielsen (harp, bouzouki, vocals) and they all manage to get to their gigs in good order, at least as the Irish measure time. They played to an enthusiastic crowd on St. Patrick's Day at the Schwartz Center in Dover and have become regulars at several other events where reels, jigs, and the songs of the emerald isle are in demand.

Their rendering of Celtic music is heartfelt, authentic, and springs from a deep interest and abiding respect for the where it all started. All of Celtic Harvest are



not only excellent musicians, but expert in the origins and stories behind the music they play, and they perform the music on the traditional

instruments. To me, Irish music is a lot like Mexican food. I wouldn't want a steady diet of it, but I miss it if I don't get some once in a while.

Speaking of food--as usual, we'll be collecting items for the Delaware Food Bank and we ask that audience members bring donations of non-perishable food and useful personal care items such as shampoo and toothpaste. Garnet Rogers got us started doing this, and as he noted, "It's an enormous privilege for me to be able to stand up and sing my own songs, but I would like to be able to have something left behind after the dust is cleared away where people are actually benefiting from the concert at some level. If you think you know what hungry feels like, you should try it full-time."

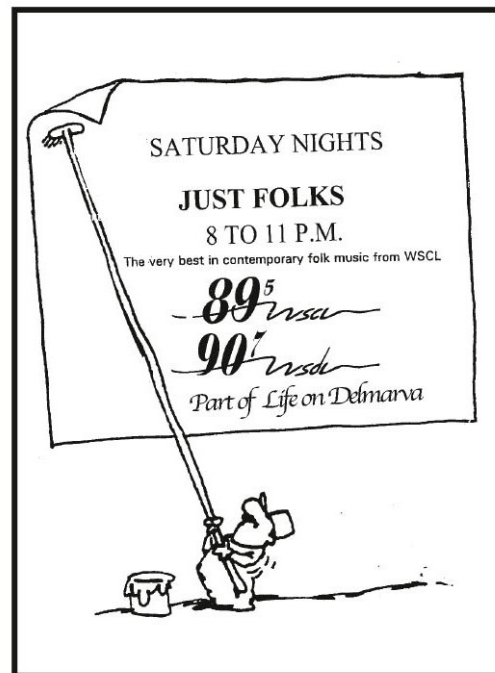

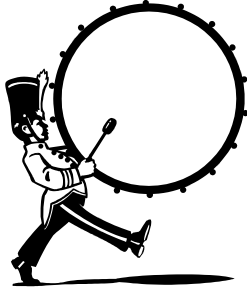
The Festival and Board meetings meet on the first Wednesday of the month starting at 6:30 for the Festival meeting, and 7:30 for the Board meeting. Since this is the dinner hour for many board members, we typically have dinner while holding the meeting. We'd love to find a public place that serves reasonably priced food and has a semi-quiet area that can accommodate 15-20 people where we can hear each other talk (i.e. no loud music or video games).

In the meantime, our June 7th Festival and Board meetings will be held at City Tap, on Commerce Street in Smyrna (the building still says "Crystal Pistol" on it).

In addition, you may or may not have noticed that we haven't held a **Pick-in** in a few months. We need a new home for this event as well. Pick-Ins have been held on the 4th Saturday of the month, at 1pm, but we would entertain the idea of adjusting that schedule if necessary. Pick-Ins will be officially "on-hold" until we find a new, suitable venue.

Area Music News

I just updated the calendar on the Delfolk.org web site, and I'm tired just THINKING about all of the great music that is there for you to enjoy this month. The calendar now has updated information from the Dover Summer Series on the Green, Longwood Gardens, various festivals, and much more! Here are some of the options you should really check out:

- Our own Friends of Folk **Coffeehouse on May 20** will feature **Vickie Russell** on piano and guitar, and of course with her wonderful voice and introspective, elegant songwriting. Vickie played at a Cooldog concert last year – even when she's singing about a sad topic, she can still make it sound and feel wonderful. Her husband Dave will accompany her on guitar. Opening for Vickie will be our local heroes Celtic Harvest, doing a variety of Celtic traditional songs.
- **Cooldog** will be hosting long-time favorites **The Kennedys** on Saturday May 27th at 3pm. Pete and Maura are always a blast, and it's been about 2 years since they've performed in the area, so catch them this time! Opening will be **Catherine Tuttle**, who at age 19 has a great CD out, is spectacularly talented, insanely cute, and is a freshman at Harvard.
- If it's not too early in the festival season for you, you really need to grab your mom or your kids or both and spend Mother's Day weekend (May 12-14) at the **Susquehanna Music & Arts Festival**. It's in Darlington, Maryland, near Havre de Grace, probably about an hour or so from our area. They have cabin camping (with electricity and showers), and can move everything indoors in case of inclement weather. And the line-up is stellar, including our favs **Andy & Denise, The Dreamsicles** (with Tom Prasada-Rao, multiple Wammie and Kerrville winner), **Spirit Wing, Pat Victor, Aztec Two Step, disappear fear, We're About 9**, and many, many more. - May will also see the start of the popular Summer Series on the Green – a free concert series every Thursday night at 7pm on the Green in Downtown Dover. Bring a lawn chair, a beverage and some bug spray, and you'll be set! Jerry Haines will be there May 25th. If you're into jazz, Joe Baione, Lake Forest music teacher and nationally recognized vibes musician will be performing with his trio on June 1.

If you're looking to get out of town for Race Weekend (June 3-4), there are several options.

- **Simple Gifts** will be playing their eclectic music at Longwood Gardens on June 3rd.
- Andy's in Chestertown will be hosting Roots / Alt-Country acts **Last Train Home** – they'll be playing the Delmarva Folk Festival in October, so you can get a preview.
- **Appel Farm Fest** on June 3rd, which features **Richard Thompson, Janis Ian, Fountains of Wayne, Duncan Sheik and Toad the Wet Sprocket**. The site is in far south NJ, about 20 minutes from the Delaware Memorial Bridge.
- **The Rehoboth Beach Country & Blues Festival** – a new offering from the Rehoboth Jazz festival folks, will feature Kenny Rogers, Buckwheat Zydeco and Marcia Ball, among others. See rehobothjazz.com for more info
