Greg Shrader Songwriter Circle June 10

It's hard to believe that over four years have slipped away since Greg Shrader passed from this existence. But in what has evolved into an annual event, this month's coffee house will have Greg's touch. A long time ago, he suggested the idea of a songwriter's workshop. Greg wrote a lot of choice songs and was quite knowledgeable about the craft musically, lyrically, spiritually, and any other way you can think of. His original vision was to do the workshop as a session by and for songwriters, possibly as a sidelight to the Delmarva Folk Festival. It wasn't too much of a challenge to convince him that others would be interested too, so the idea of a songwriters coffee house was born.

For the few months before his passing, Greg and I had been working on the idea. He was committed to doing it in June of 2002 and had it pretty well cultivated in his head as far as format and who else he wanted on stage with him. I never got the chance to get the whole picture, and I'm only aware of a few good friends he wanted there, but know he had others in mind.

After Greg left us, it was decided to go ahead and try to make it work. If nothing else, it would be as good a tribute to Greg as there could be. We've pulled it off four times now, and it seems fitting to try to do it every June, just because.

Deloy Moore was one of Greg's picks and he'll be leading things again this year, along with his daughter Larissa. Deloy has written enough songs to fill several thick notebooks (I've seen them). He writes about life from a lot of different angles and in different styles and will of course have a Greg song or two to dispense. Deloy has brought back his daughter and one friend from last year, and has recruited two veterans of previous circles and one newcomer to our stage to explore the fine art of songwriting.

With her soulful voice and skilled guitar playing, Larissa Moore is no stranger to the music scene. Being the daughter of local musician and multi-instrumentalist Deloy Moore has given her a lifelong

exposure to the local music scene. In addition to her father, artists ranging from Janis Joplin, Pat Benatar, and Mariah Carey to Johnny Cash, Tom Petty, and the Cranberries have influenced Larissa.

From her very first performance at a Delmarva Friends of Folk Coffee house through today, Larissa has been a popular performer at local open microphones, churches, and talent shows since the age of 15.

While primarily a solo performer, Larissa has had experience playing with a few local bands and her current project is the new group The Lusionistics. Now 19, she writes and performs her own material and has learned piano and bass guitar. Larissa's eclectic musical sets consist of original material as well as contemporary covers of various popular artists.

Last year's veteran, Tad Jones, may be better-known to FoF members as the sound man at our Delmarva Folk Festival. Along with that considerable talent, he's also a multi-instrumentalist and songwriter, but he has only recently begun sharing this hidden side with us. He's composed some thoughtful, introspective songs about love, life, and all the twists and turns we encounter on our path. His original songs are like a breath of fresh air. Ranging from subjects such as love to places you have seen and heard about, songs about life in a small town, fine wine, simple and free. Tad was born near Nashville but came to Delaware as a youngster. He owns Root Cellar Studios in Dover, where he has recorded a number of artists. Tad recorded two of his songs in Nashville and will play one of them at the circle and several new ones. He has played with Greg Ellingsworth as Tad and Greg and is currently performing with Deloy and Mike Hastings as Tangled Roots and The Waterbillies.

We will welcome two veterans of previous circles, Justin McNatt and Lonnie Field, and one newcomer this year, in the person of Todd Murray. Todd is a singer/songwriter guitarist who writes his own songs. He has a unique guitar and voice style. Keeping it in the family, he is Deloy's nephew and we are delighted to have him at The Greg Shrader Songwriter Circle. Todd will have his latest CD with him as well.

Delaware Native Justin McNatt is a 21 year old singer/songwriter who grew up in Smyrna. He is a self-taught guitarist that started recording acoustic CDs when he was 18. His wonderful chord progressions, inventive lyrics, and evocative performance style made him a pleasure to listen and watch. One of his first public performances was at an open mic coffee house a number of years ago. We're glad to welcome him to the circle.

At just 21 years old, Justin already has 3 CDs to his credit. The first is a compilation of songs simply titled JUSTIN MCNATT, that features songs written from ages 18-20, which received substantial airplay on Wilmington station WSTW 93.7 Hometown Heroes. In early fall of 2004 he recorded HOT ONE, another acoustic album. His latest 5 song demo CD, JUSTIN MCNATT PREVIEW, was produced by New York based Tomas Costanza.

Lonnie Field has been a staple on the Delaware Folk Music scene for over 2 decades. He was a close friend of Greg's and would have been in Greg's lineup. Lonnie is a talented singer-songwriter who also plays traditional and cover songs in a mix of Contemporary Folk, Blues, Bluegrass, Country, and Rock genres. He's been the leader of Sandcreek for it's entire existence and has a stack of songs that rivals anyone I know. In addition, he and his lovely wife Sonja have been the host of the Delmarva Folk Festival for the past 15 years.

The plan is for these artists to take turns explaining something about how they write, what inspires them, what makes a good song. Then they'll play one of their songs, maybe solo, maybe with help. Kind of a song swap, but with an audience. So we're gonna do the best we can, and leave it to Greg's spirit to guide us the rest of the way.

As with past years' efforts there's no way to predict how this will come out; it's an experiment from start to finish. And remember--it's not FOR Greg, it's BY Greg.

It all starts at 7:30 pm, Saturday, June 10, in The Underground on the Wesley College campus in Dover. Admission for this special coffee house is only \$5 for members and \$7 for non-members, plus a donation for the Delaware Food Bank. Lots of Kelly and Zeke's fresh coffee, Mrs. Field's sweet treats, and plenty of cool drinks will be there, and we hope you'll be there too.

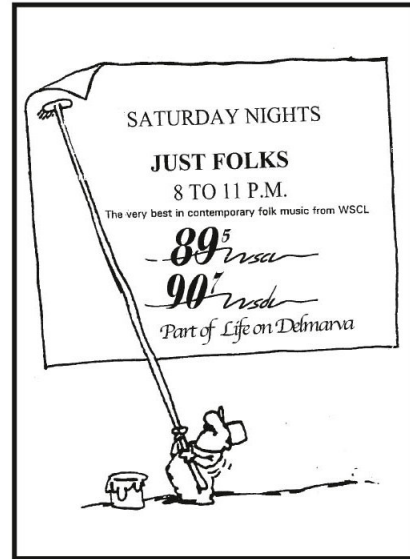

Delaware State Fair looking for performers

This year, several genres of music will be featured on the Delaware Electric Cooperative's Free Entertainment Stage during the course of the concert series, including: July 21, Pop/Soft Rock; July 22, Oldies; July 28, Hard Rock; and July 29, Country. Each day, a panel of judges will evaluate each performance on a set of predetermined criteria and select a daily winner. Each of the four winners will receive, courtesy of MTS Broadcasting and Kevin Travers of Riverside Studios, a five hour recording session
